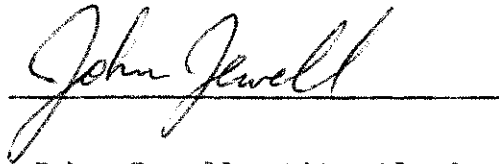

Mayor Hylton read a letter from the Sheriff congratulating Overbrook on Dale's graduating from Police Officers Training School.

A brief discusseion followed in regard to whether the council wanted to become involved with Eckan, which is primarily interested in low-rental housing. The council agreed not to get involved with Eckan.

It was agræed to ask the JayCee's to be Overbrook's weather watch team, to be in contact with the Sheriff's office by CB radio in threatening weather.

Mayor Hylton brought up the fact the city does not have collision insurance on the city fire truck. Jerry Caffman made a motion to put collosion insurance on the truck if it isn't over \$50.00 per year. Dencan seconded. Passed unan.

Mayor Hylton showed a picture that the 8th grade class wants to paint on the panel in front of the ~~Sk~~ Fisher building lot.

Duncan made a motion the city pay the annexation bills to Steve Jones on the FrieRuble addition and the Norton Annexation. Anderson seconded, passed unan.

O'Bryhim made a motion to adjourn. Anderson seconded. Passed unan.

Mr Beckley informed the council that he had been to a meeting of the Bease County Assoc. of mental health. He encouraged everyone to buy an active membership in the association and felt it was a very worthy cause.

A discussion followed in regard to street improvements for 1972. Mayor Hytten said he would contact Sam Condit and Blackton Condit and ask them to submit bids for repaving streets.

Wmone Stout made a motion to sell the Foster property to the 1st National Bank for \$100,000 if it is legal to do it that way. Coffman seconded. Passed then.

Mayor Hytten said Southside Cleaners of Ottawa had approached him in regard to having a house to have dry cleaning service if the Council didn't object. The Council was indifferent and it was decided to let Southside use their own judgment in regard to this.

The mayor reappointed the existing appointed city officials to serve another term.

Bob Duncan made a motion to allow plastic pipe to be used to run the sewer line to the new concession stand unless ordinance can be adopted on plastic pipe. Anderson seconded and passed then.

Mayor Hytten brought up the problem of whether to extend the main water line west in the middle of the street to Ed Lee's new house or to run a smaller line down the ditch. The latter would avoid turning up the street which was just improved last year. The Council agreed to run the line down the ditch.

Heretofore names were appointed to the Township Board for the following year by Mayor Hytten.

Duncan made a motion to endorse the Pride Program. Anderson seconded and passed unan.

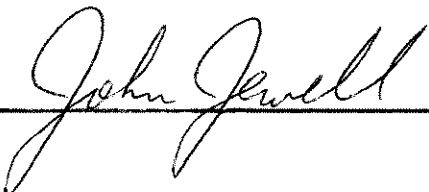
City Clerk is to write to League of Municipalities to get information of adopting an ordinance to prohibit derelict cars in Overbrook.

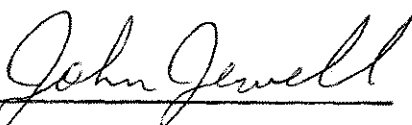

after a discussion, the City Council agreed to leave the beer license fee at \$50.00 for 1973.

Bob Duncan made a motion to transfer \$500.00 from the general account to the Nina Schlink Pool fund. Coffman seconded and it passed unan.
