PRIDE Plant Sale & New Exercise Equipment – Bill Shipp will “head up” the plant sale again this year with the help of PRIDE members and individuals from the Master Gardener’s program. The sale will take place the weekend of the City Wide Garage Sales, April 26 & 27 at the Old Gym, 306 Ash Street from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. When spring weather arrives work will begin at the city lake with the installation of exercise equipment along the lake walkway which will hopefully include a balance beam and pull up and push up stations. Distance markers will also be put in place on the sidewalk.

Rodeo and Mutton Bustin’ – The 4th Annual All-Star Rodeo and Mutton Bustin’ will be on Friday, May 3rd and Saturday, May 4th at the Overbrook Fairgrounds. Mutton Bustin’ will be at 6 pm with sign ups at 5 pm. The Rodeo starts at 7pm. Admission is \$10 for adults, \$5 for children 6-12 years old, and children under 5 are free.

Electronic Waste Drive – On Saturday, May 4th, the Santa Fe Trail Green Team is hosting the 5th Annual E-waste Drive from 10 am to 2 pm. This event will occur at Santa Fe Trail High School. They will be accepting electronic devices, such as phones, televisions, monitors, PCs, toasters, microwaves, etc. The Green Team will even take a washing machine! Unfortunately, this year there will be a \$10 charge for CRTs and any TV that is not a flat screen, because these items are costly to move and recycle. Grilled hot dogs, chips, and a soda will be served for only \$3.00 with proceeds being donated to a family in need in our community. Please remember that anyone 16 and over must have a valid Kansas fishing license to fish in the City Lake. Length and creel limits must also be followed. There are 3 kiosks at the lake with the creel and length limits posted on them. The children's pond, located at the south end of the City Lake is for kids 16 and younger. Adults may help the younger kids with casting or reeling in the 'big one' but please, adults, no fishing while the kids are off playing at the playground or exploring the pond area. Also, if you put a canoe, kayak, or boat in the water, any child, 12 and younger, **MUST** be wearing a U.S.C.G. approved life jacket. There also **MUST** be a floatation device for each person in the boat. Let's all have fun at the lake this year, but let's also be safe. Thanks. Chief Terry Hollingsworth

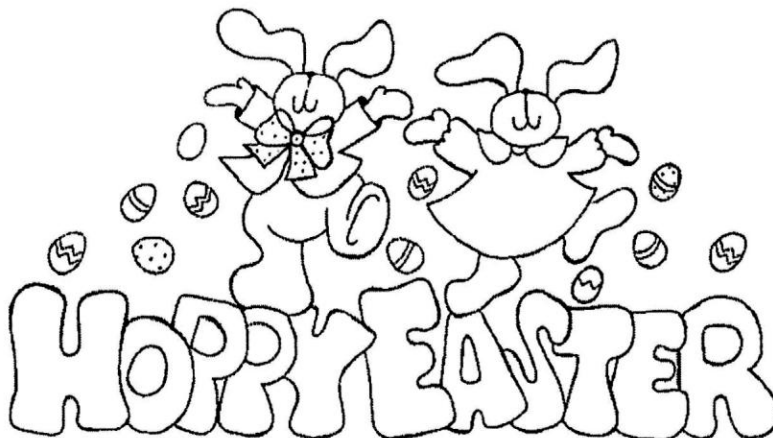
