November City Council Meeting Change – The November City Council Meeting will be held on the third Wednesday instead of the second Wednesday due to Veteran's Day. The meeting will be held November 18th at 7:00 pm at City Hall.

Chili and Vegetable Soup Supper – The Overbrook Bible Church invites you to their 2nd Annual Fund raiser on Thursday, November 5 from 5:00 -8:00 pm. Homemade pies and cinnamon rolls will also be served!

Daylight Savings Time Ends – The first Sunday in November is when Daylight Saving Time ends. So, we'll "fall back" one hour and return to Standard Time on Sunday, November 1, 2020, at 2:00 am. Be sure to set your clocks back one hour before bed Saturday night, and replace the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors!

Deadline for Posting Addresses – Address numbers must be posted on all business and resident buildings, not mailboxes, by Jan 1, 2021. The numbers must be at least 3 inches tall and visible from the road to follow the city ordinance and to support our 911 system. Thank you for helping our town to be safe.

Overbrook Police Department - Here it is, the end of October. It's getting dark early and getting cold. This means that Kansas wildlife is on the move once again. The rut is rapidly approaching, and the bucks seem to be everywhere. Please use caution while driving, especially around the dusk through dawn hours. Try to avoid swerving to avoid hitting any animal. Swerving can cause even worse crashes. Hitting an oncoming vehicle, especially head on could end in tragedy. There are some deep ravines along some of the highways so swerving to the right means you could end up in a deep ditch for a long period of time before emergency crews can locate you. Slow down, keep both hands on the steering wheel and keep alert. If you do hit a deer, turn on your hazard lights and pull over to a safe spot if possible. Alert Law Enforcement of any injuries in the vehicle. You will need an accident report if the damage is over \$100.00. 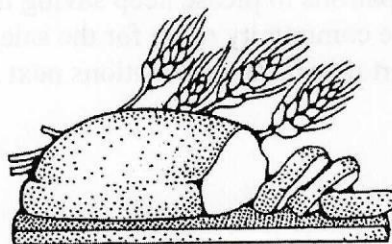

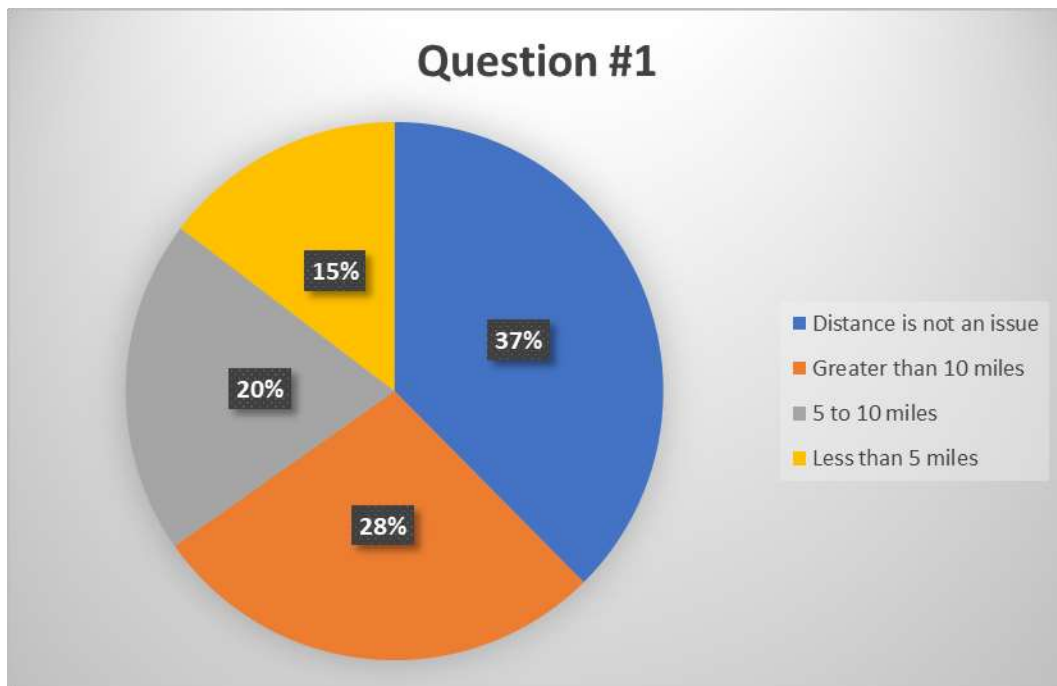


Overbrook Grocery Store - Results for the Community

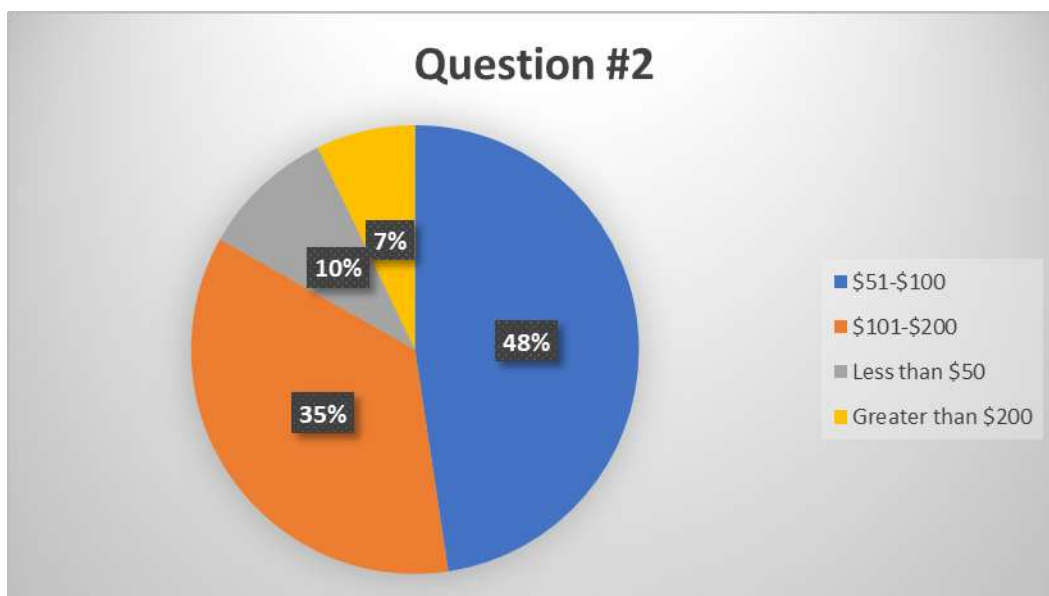

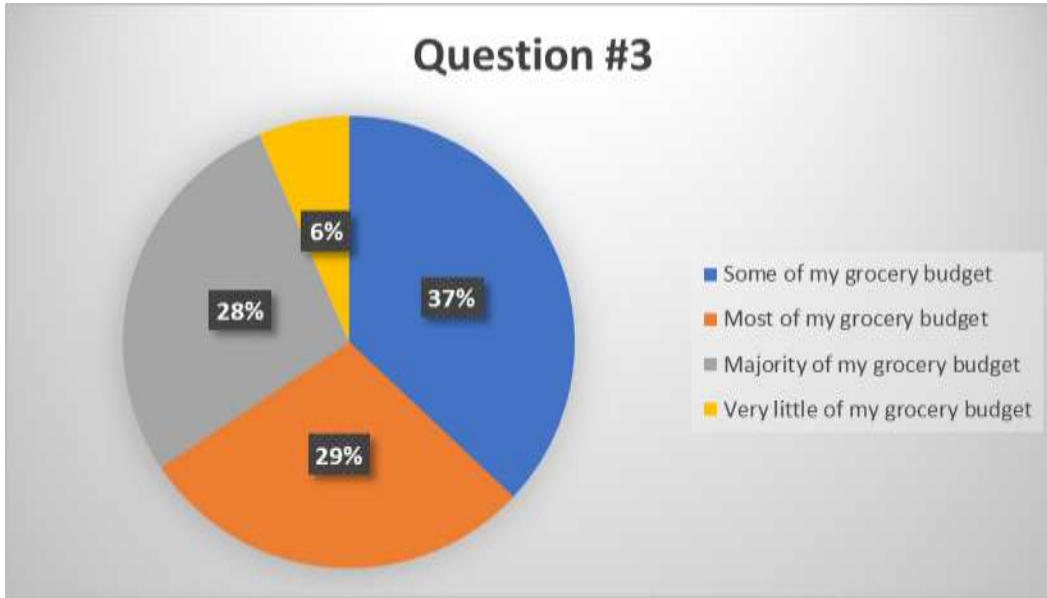
1. What distance are you willing to travel to get groceries?



2. What is your household's weekly grocery budget?

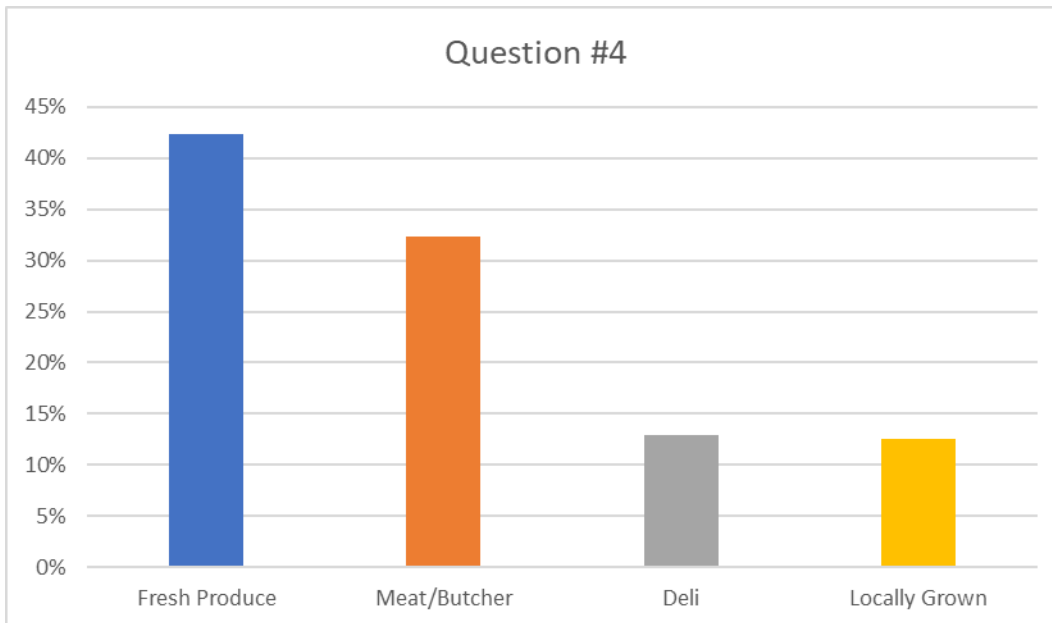


3. How much of your grocery budget would you spend at an Overbrook grocery?



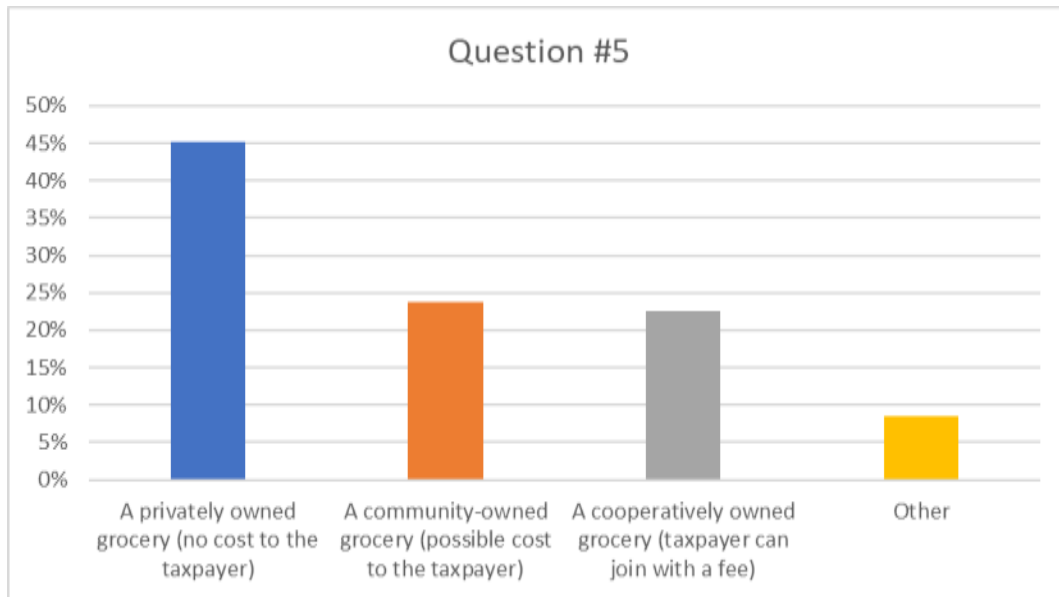
4. Which of these is the most important to you?

This question was answered multiple choice by many respondents

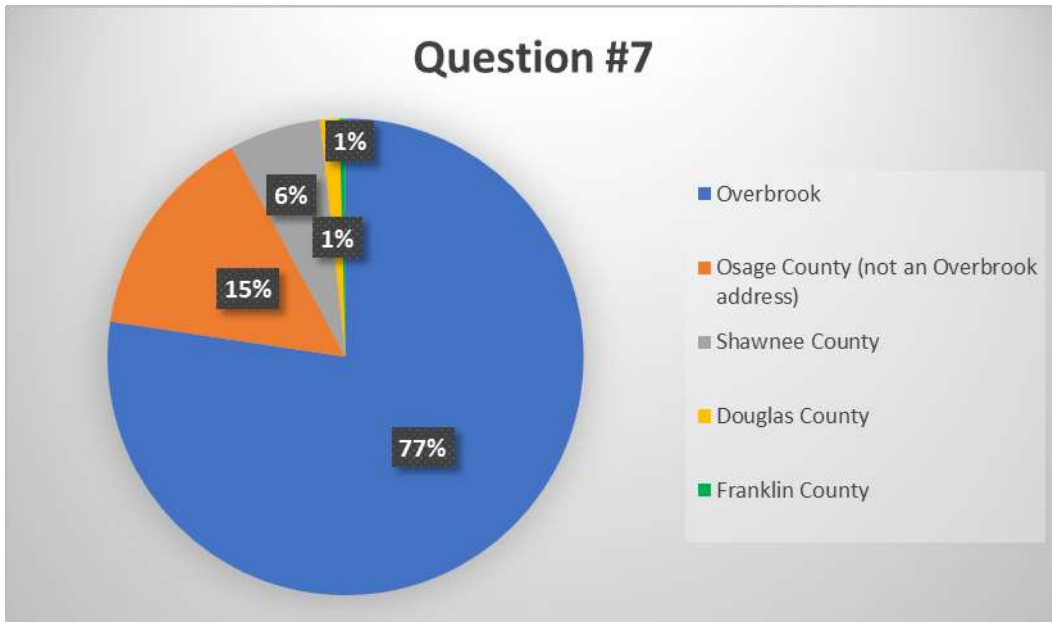


6. Would you like to see any other business jointly operate with the grocery?
