The Steve Cross Memorial Kids' Fishing Derby – The City of Overbrook's Park and Rec Committee along with Overbrook Rotary, the Overbrook Community Foundation, and Overbrook PRIDE are once again sponsoring the annual fishing derby for kids, toddlers to sixteen, at the Kid's Fishing Pond on Saturday, September 12, 2020. Age Groups 1 (Pre-K and younger), 2 (Kindergarten and 1st Grade), and 3 (2nd and 3rd Grade) will fish from 9AM to 9:45AM (with registration beginning at 8:30AM). Age Groups 4 (4th thru 6th Grade) and 5 (7th thru Age 16) will fish from 10:15AM to 11:30AM (with registration beginning at 10:00AM). An adult should accompany all children ages 10 and under. OPR is grateful for the support our local and national businesses give to this event and for the Rotary Club Volunteers who run the derby. Additional volunteers are needed this year. If you are interested, please contact City Hall.

Overbrook Police Department – The Santa Fe School District is back in session. In Overbrook, the school zone times are from 7:00am – 8:00am and from 3:00pm -4:00pm. School zone speed limits are strictly enforced. Remember, as you travel around Overbrook Attendance Center, that Oak Street, between 7th Street and 8th Street (US 56), is permanently closed to through traffic, except for authorized vehicles. Please keep our children safe as they travel to and from school.

Soccer and Cornhole League Sign-Ups – The deadline for soccer sign-ups has been extended to Monday, September 7th. The sign-up deadline for the Cornhole League has been extended a week as well. The City of Overbrook Park and Recreation Department, Overbrook Rotary, the Overbrook Community Foundation and Overbrook PRIDE will hold the 12th Annual Steve Cross Memorial Children's Fishing Derby on Saturday, September 12th, 2020! The Derby is named in memory of Steve Cross, who was an integral part of this derby since its inception and his contributions to it were many and great.

The event will be held at the Children's Fishing Pond at Jones Park in Overbrook. Registration is free and OPR suggests those interested take advantage of pre-registration by returning forms to City Hall. Please do so by 5PM on Friday, September 11th. If you do not pre-register, registrations will be taken as you enter Jones Park.

To further assist with social distancing, this year we are splitting the fishing times to help keep the group sizes smaller. Bait will be provided. This is a catch and release derby (once fish has been weighed).

Age Groups 1, 2 and 3 will fish from 9AM to 9:45AM (with registration beginning at 8:30AM).

Age Group 1 is for Pre-K and younger, Group 2 is for Kindergarten and 1st Grade, and Group 3 is for 2nd and 3rd Grade.

Age Groups 4 and 5 will fish from 10:15AM to 11:30AM (with registration beginning at 10:00AM).

Age Group 4 is for Grades 4 through 6, Age Group 5 is for Grades 7 through Age 16.

Contestants must be 16 years of age or younger. Every child will receive a goodie bag at the conclusion of their section of the derby. These goodie bags will be distributed as you leave the derby. There will not be a prize drawing this year but the goodie bags will include a fishing pole! The largest fish, smallest fish, and most fish (by weight) in each age group will be calculated following the conclusion of the Derby. Those trophies in each Age Group will be presented at a later date. The rain date is September 19th (1:30PM). As with everything else in this time of COVID-19, we welcome participants and their families to take any precautions they feel necessary to help maintain the health and safety of everyone involved. 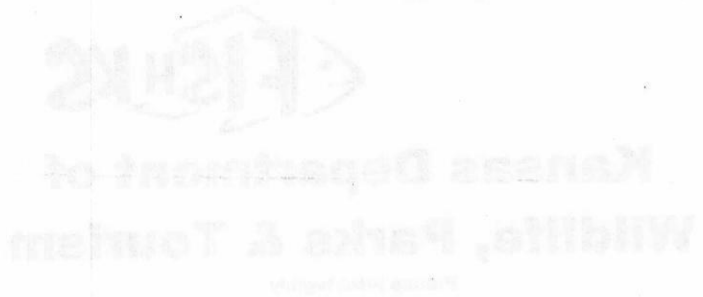
