City News – City Council voted unanimously to approve four new City Ordinances (#394, 395, 396 & 397) related to unlawful possession of Marijuana and drug paraphernalia. The City now has additional authority to prosecute individuals charged with possession of those materials.

City Public Works Notice – Fire Hydrants all across town are regularly opened to allow flushing of our water lines. **If you see a hydrant open and draining –DO NOT SHUT IT OFF!** Damage to the hydrant and to the water lines can occur! Call Maintenance at 785-806-9502 if you have a concern!

Overbrook Police Department has replaced their 2005 Ford police car with a newer model used vehicle purchased from the Kansas Highway Patrol. It will be in service starting this month. The 2005 Ford (blue car) will be sold by sealed bid. If you have interest in it, inquire at City Hall.

Upcoming election for seats in Overbrook City Government

Tuesday, November 7, 2017, is Election Day for the City of Overbrook. This is the first time City elections will be held in November. In the past they've been held in April.

This year's election will fill three positions on Overbrook City Government; two Council Member seats and, the office of Mayor. All three positions are for a four-year term of volunteer service ending the second Monday of January 2021. A simple "Guide for City Candidates" is available at Overbrook City Hall, which will provide valuable details. Filing as a candidate must be done at the Osage County Clerk's office in Lyndon before Noon, June 1, 2017.

Overbrook is a City of the Third Class (defined by population) and is governed by a five member Council and a Mayor. Two Council positions and the Mayor are elected one year and three Council positions are elected two years later. There is currently no limit to the number of terms an elected official can serve.

By City Ordinance, Overbrook City Council has one meeting each month; the second Wednesday at 7pm. Typically, meetings last three to three and a half hours. Preparation for each meeting is necessary. The City Clerk organizes and makes available electronically in advance all materials related to the Meeting Agenda so Council and Mayor can review and come prepared. Attendance at each meeting is very important.

Council member service is non-partisan (candidates need not declare political party affiliation) and serve "at large" (Overbrook is not divided into Wards). By the direction of the Mayor, each Council member may serve as a Liaison with one or more of the City Departments and Boards/Commissions. These include Administration, Public Works, Law, City Pool, Planning & Zoning Commission, Park & Recreation Commission, Public Library Board, and the Housing Authority (Oak Plaza apartments).

All elected officials are involved in all discussion and decision making for all City operations including city finance, employee management and benefits, water/sewer operations, street maintenance, public safety and interaction with each of the above listed Boards and Commissions. An understanding of these areas of business management is of value.

Resources are readily available to help an elected official understand his/her duties, authority, and ethical responsibility. The League of Kansas Municipalities (LKM.org) in Topeka has a Municipal Training Institute providing three levels of instruction each with certified achievement recognition (registration fees paid by the City). The current Mayor and two Council members have utilized this training to reach Level 2 completion.

Being an elected official can a personally rewarding job. Being a part of the nucleus that creates/promotes/maintains city growth and improvement is vital to the City, it's residents and businesses. If you have interest in serving in Overbrook City Government, now is the time. Filing can be done now until the deadline on June 1 at Noon at the County Clerk's Office in Lyndon in the Osage County Court House.
