

ORDINANCE NO. 369

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO LOUD SOUND AMPLIFICATION SYSTEMS IN MOTOR VEHICLES AND REPEALING EXISTING ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OVERBROOK, KANSAS, IN CONFLICT HEREWITH

WHEREAS, the use of loud sound amplification systems in motor vehicles presents a safety hazard to the citizens and motoring public of the city of Overbrook; and

WHEREAS, the use of loud sound amplification systems can prevent the operator of a motor vehicle from hearing approaching or overtaking emergency vehicles, and can distract a driver's attention from the safe operation of motor vehicles within the city; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OVERBROOK, KANSAS:

Section 1. LOUD SOUND AMPLIFICATION SYSTEMS PROHIBITED.

(a) No person operating or occupying a motor vehicle on a street, highway, alley, parking lot, or driveway shall operate or permit the operation of any sound amplification system from within the vehicle so that the sound is plainly audible at a distance of 50 or more feet from the vehicle.

(b) Sound Amplification system means any radio, tape player, computer, compact disc player, loud speaker, or other electronic devise used for the amplification of sound..

(c) Plainly audible means any sound produced by a sound amplification system from within the vehicle, which clearly can be heard at a distance of 50 feet or more. Measurement standards shall be by the auditory senses, based upon direct line of sight. Words or phrases need not be discernible and bass reverberations are included. The motor vehicle may be stopped, standing, parked or moving on a street, highway, alley, parking lot, or driveway.

(d) It is an affirmative defense to a charge under this section that the operator was not otherwise prohibited by law from operating the sound amplification system, and that any of the following apply:

- (1) The system was being operated to request medical or vehicular assistance or to warn of a hazardous road condition;
- (2) The vehicle was an emergency or public safety vehicle;
- (3) The vehicle was owned and operated by the City of Overbrook, or a gas, electric, communications or refuse company;

- (4) The system was used for the purpose of giving instructions, directions, talks, addresses, lectures or transmitting music to any persons or assemblages of persons in compliance with the ordinances of the city of Overbrook;
- (5) The vehicle was used in authorized public activities, such as parades, fireworks, sports events, musical productions and other activities, which have the approval of the department of the city authorized to grant such approval.


Section 2. PENALTY.

Any person, individual, partnership, corporation or association who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance is guilty of an ordinance violation, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 or by imprisonment of not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each day any violation hereof is found to exist or continues to exist shall be a separate offense and punishable as such hereunder.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.


This ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and publication once in the official city newspaper.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 370

AN ORDINANCE ATTESTING TO AN INCREASE IN TAX REVENUES FOR BUDGET YEAR 2014 FOR THE City of Overbrook

WHEREAS, the City of Overbrook must continue to provide services to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of this community; and

WHEREAS, the cost of providing essential services to the citizens of this city continues to increase.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Overbrook:

Section One. In accordance with state law, the City of Overbrook has scheduled a public hearing and has prepared the proposed budget necessary to fund city services from January 1, 2014 until December 31, 2014.

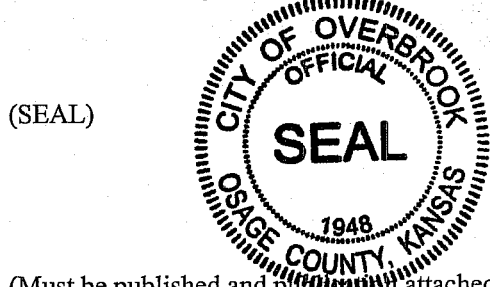
Section Two. After careful public deliberations, the governing body has determined that in order to maintain the public services that are essential for the citizens of this city, it will be necessary to budget property tax revenues in an amount exceeding the levy in the 2013 budget.

Section Three. This ordinance shall take effect after publication once in the official city newspaper.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF OVERBROOK, KANSAS: INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES, "EDITION OF 2013", PROVIDING CERTAIN PENALTIES AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 366.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OVERBROOK, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE.


There is hereby incorporated by reference for the City of Overbrook, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities", Edition of 2013, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. No fewer than three (3) copies of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 371, and to which shall be attached a copy of this Ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The Police department, Municipal Judge, and all administrative departments of the city charged with the enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication in the official city newspaper as provided by law.



SECTION 1. INCORPORATING UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE.





AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 368 BY CHANGING THE PROVISIONS OF SECTIONS 2 AND 6 REGARDING DELINQUENT WATER BILLS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OVERBROOK,
KANSAS:

SECTION 2. THAT all **new service activations** require a \$25 non-refundable activation fee in addition to any associated new service costs such as adding a meter or tapping in to the sewer. A **new service activation** is defined as every time someone activates service at a new location.

SECTION 6. THAT a non-refundable Reconnect Fee of \$25.00 will be charged when service is reconnected following disconnection for an unpaid bill.



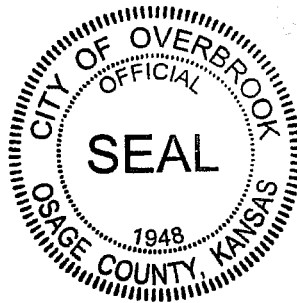

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OVERBROOK, KANSAS:


SECTION 1: The following described street in the City of Overbrook, Osage County, Kansas:

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage approval and publication as provided by law.





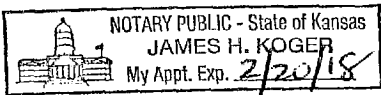
