Neighborhood Revitalization Program

PROPERTY TAX REBATE INCENTIVE

The Osage County Neighborhood Revitalization Program (NRP) is designed to give property owners in Osage County the opportunity to receive a ten-year tax rebate on the increased value of the property. The rebate is applied to the additional property taxes that are incurred as a result of the rehabilitation of a property or new construction. This does not affect your current property taxes. The rebate is determined based on the eligible increase in your taxes for the % from each of the property's participating entities. If your town, township, or fire district is not a participating taxing entity, you will still receive the county's portion of the property taxes in the rebate. You are still required to pay all property taxes, but you will be rebated a percentage of the increase that is due to the improvements if the project meets all requirements. The rebate will stay with the approved property for ten years, even if the property is sold.

Eligible Property Types

- Residential, Commercial, Industrial, Historical and Agricultural Properties
 - Rehabilitation, alterations, and additions to any new existing residential structure
- New construction of Residential, Commercial and Industrial

Improvements to existing or construction of new residential accessory structure such as garages, gazebos, storage buildings, workshops, swimming pools shall not be eligible.
