- Each complaint must include the name and contact information of the individual submitting it.

This process allows the Council to properly review, investigate, and follow up on concerns in a timely and transparent way. Written submissions help us maintain accurate records and ensure accountability throughout the resolution process.

Please note that anonymous complaints will not be considered. We believe that constructive dialogue works best when we can communicate directly with those who raise concerns.

Complaints may be submitted by mail, email, or delivered in person to City Hall during regular business hours. If you have questions about this policy or need assistance preparing your written complaint, please contact the City Clerk's office.
