Water Conservation in the home – In 2024 each month we will have a water conservation tip that might help reduce your water bill. This month's tip is for the bathroom sink. Turn Off the Water After You Wet Your Toothbrush. There is no need to keep the water running while brushing your teeth. Just wet your brush and fill a glass for mouth rinsing. Rinse Your Razor in the Sink, Fill the sink with a few inches of warm water. 

Begins at 8:30 AM for Grades 3 and younger Group will fish from 9:00 AM to 9:45 AM


Begins at 9:15 AM for Grades 4 through Age 16 Group will fish from 10:00 AM to 11:30 AM
