

## **Overbrook City News and Events August 2021**

**Water Project** – The contractor for the project contacted the engineering firm regarding a decrease in availability for materials needed as well as an increase in cost for materials due to recent events. The City of Overbrook wants to get the project started as soon as possible; however, the unexpected difficulties continue to hold up the start date. The city will discuss with Rural Development options about paying for these additional expenditures. We will continue to keep you updated on the progress of the water project.

**Overbrook Police Department** – School will be starting soon and I would like to pass on some basic safety tips: Watch for pedestrians in crosswalks -they have the right of way every time! Watch for school crossing guards in the mornings and afternoons on US 56 at Oak as well as on 7<sup>th</sup> at Oak and Elm. Never drive around a school bus when red lights are flashing and the stop sign is out! Watch out for school zones and remember that fines are doubled in school zones as well as construction zones. And finally, parents; please teach your kids when they are out walking or riding their bikes and they hear sirens, they need to get to a curb or side of the road as quickly as possible and stay there until the emergency vehicle passes by.
