The Overbrook Bible Church is a good place to take shelter at as well as the Kansas State Bank. Both have offered to let the community use their buildings in the event of a tornado and the Fire Department and Police Department have access to the buildings. Also, if you do not have a basement or shelter of your own, check with neighbors to see if they do and if you can shelter in theirs. Overbrook Community Chest Committee – reports that the goal set for the 2021/2022 Community Chest Drive has been reached and exceeded due to the generosity of the community. Townhall Meeting – We had a good turnout for our April 26th Townhall Meeting. We aim to have another one later in July.

Overbrook Farmer's Market - The Overbrook Farmer's Market will now be held at the Fairgrounds, beginning May 30th!

Friends of the Library – are accepting new and renewal memberships for 2022. Forms are available at the library. **BOOKS, BOOKS:** If you are cleaning out this month, keep the library in mind to donate your gently used books. Friends of the Library are collecting books for the sale in July. Books can be taken to the library or dropped off on the west side of the library. Let's help them get ready for a great book sale!

Pet Owners – If you own dogs or cats within the city limits of Overbrook, please remember according to City Ordinance #408, it is required to annually tag your pets over 6 months of age. A license year runs from January 1 to December 31. Registration requires proof of current rabies vaccination. Fees for "neutered" tags are \$5 and for "non-neutered" tags are \$10. Pets found at large without a tag may be impounded and owners may be fined.

Water Project – Ever wonder what the colors of the construction flags in your yard mean? According to the American Public Works Association, White is for proposed excavation, Pink is for Temporary Survey Markings, Red is for Electric Power Lines, Cables, Conduit and Lighting Cables, Yellow is for Gas, Oil, Steam, Petroleum, or Gaseous Materials, Orange is for Communication, Alarm or Signal Lines, Cables or Conduit, Blue is for Potable Water, Purple is for Reclaimed Water, Irrigation and Slurry Lines, and Green is for Sewers and Drain Lines. It's good information to learn because I thought (Crimson and) Blue was for National Championships and Purple meant you were a Cat Fan! Seriously though, the contractor has asked that we keep existing flags in place until after they do the service crossovers. If you have any questions or concerns about the water distribution project, please contact City Hall at 665-7328 or fill out an email at https://overbrookks.com/contact-us Landscape and seeding will begin after the service crossovers are completed.

Council Meeting Update- Solid Waste and Recycling News: Our contract with Osage Waste contains a clause if the cost of operation has a sufficient increase (dump fees and fuel) allowing the Contractor to come before the Council for a raise. Osage Waste made the request for an increase for those reasons at the April 13th Council Meeting. Residential trash service will go up by \$3.14 per month, and recycling will go up \$1.55 per month. Dumpsters will go up by approximately 20%. This increase will be seen on your next bill due in June. The Council has put in place Council Meeting Rules of Procedure. The policy will be adopted after we try it out for a for a few meetings before ironing out the final version. You can see a draft copy on the news section of www.overbrookks.com or on the City facebook page (City of Overbrook). The Library Board and the Planning and Zoning Commission may soon have the ability to have Board/Commission members that live within 10 miles of the Overbrook City Limit. Charter Ordinances 18 and 19 are in their 60-day protest period in which citizens could collect signatures for a protest of the ordinance. Visit our city facebook page or website for more information on these Charter Ordinances. We invite citizens to join any of the committees established to help get more done for our community. The Growth Committee meets the 1st and 3rd Mondays at 7PM at City Hall, the Infrastructure Committee meets the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays at 6PM at City Hall, and the Public Safety Committee meets the 1st and 3rd Thursdays at 7PM at City Hall.

Mandatory 10-Digit Dialing coming to multiple states/area codes. To complete all local calls, you will now need to dial area code + telephone numbers. This applies to all calls within your area code that are currently dialed with seven digits. This change will begin April 24, 2021; however, if you forget and dial just 7 digits, your call will still be completed.

Beginning October 24, 2021, you must dial 10-digits (area code + telephone number) for all calls; Starting that date, local calls dialed without 7-digits may not completed.

This is my first time writing the newsletter in a long time. When I mentioned that to a friend today, he asked that I consider putting a note in the newsletter about the dangers of microwaving food in a plastic container. Here's what I found:

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), microwaving food is generally safe. However, microwaving in plastic containers is associated with increased leaching — the transfer or leaking of chemicals into food. Note that even if a plastic container is labeled "microwave safe," that simply means it won't melt.

Store safe, heat safe, eat safe

To keep your food safe, whether you're heating it or not, consider these general rules:

Choose phthalate-free and BPA-free products.

In the microwave, heat food in glass or microwave-safe porcelain.

Use paper towels, not plastic to cover food. Condensation from plastic lids could contain phthalates.

Avoid storing food in disposable plastics. Use glass, stainless steel, ceramic or wood to hold and store foods.

Throw away old plastic, as there is more leaching if it is older or cracked.

Avoid reusing plastic water bottles or takeout containers.

Do not keep water bottles near heat or in the hot sun.

Avoid placing hot liquids or foods in plastics.

Avoid freezing plastic containers, then thawing them in microwaves.

Read recycling symbols on plastic containers, and steer clear of those marked 1, 3, 6 or 7.

If you've been storing and heating food in plastic for years, don't panic. The truth is these chemicals are around us all the time. From vinyl flooring to nail polish, we'll never truly escape them. "These chemicals are everywhere, so we'll be faced with them in our lifetime," Dr. Chu says. "However, it's never too late to make healthy changes, and decrease the amount of exposure."
