**Overbrook Maintenance Department-** We have completed our smoke testing of the sewer system to check for any leaks and problems associated with the sewer. If you have experienced any smoke inside your home or business, please consider having a plumber look at your vent pipe for your sewer. There could be a crack in the vent pipe or an obstruction of the pipe which could result in sewer gases entering your home or business. These types of gases can be dangerous. It is illegal to have floor drains or sump pumps attached to the sewer. These types of drains need to be run out of your home on the ground. Fines are possible for illegal attachments. **Growth Committee** - The committee has completed or advised on most of the projects requested from Overbrook City Council such as ECKAAA Nutrition Program, family fun nights, community hand out of events, ADA compliant parking downtown, dog park discussion and many others. Our new focus will be the identification and exploration of funding opportunities to produce and promote business growth in Overbrook. This includes sourcing grants, writing applications, and coordinating required business plans to applications. Current research includes funding for broadband internet, childcare acceleration, building rehabilitation, and sidewalk refurbishment. Our next meeting will be Tuesday, September 5 from 6-8pm but we regularly meet every other Monday at City Hall. The Growth Committee is chaired by Cheryl Miller and Katie Moon. **Infrastructure Committee** - Many of you may be aware that we have been working with engineers to improve the sewer performance concerns. A survey was conducted earlier this year to investigate connections to the sewer system other than sewage. To further investigate groundwater intrusion smoke testing has been conducted over the last few weeks. We will be evaluating the data and expect to have some recommendations for sewer improvements that will be needed to ensure reliable service. We are also working on grants to improve the sidewalks in our community. Next meeting is Wednesday September 6, 6 pm at City Hall.

**Public Safety Committee** – The Public Safety committee is working on painting the community crosswalks, the development of the Community Action team (CAT is a program designed to help our community by offering services such as walking children home from school and checking on elderly residents), and they have met with other police officers in small towns to discuss community concerns.
