



City Maintenance – The City will be asphalting some additional streets this summer. You will receive a letter in the mail if your street is one that is going to have work. In addition to the paving, if you or your business would like to have your private driveway/parking lot paved at your expense, you can contact Bettis Asphalt at Bettisasphalt.com and reference Overbrook Street project. Someone from Bettis will contact you. Take time this week to look for debris that could be cleaned out of your ditch and culvert to make drainage better when the spring rains come.

City Hall – Reminder: the blue trash bins at your house are for recycling only. If there is trash placed in the bins it will not get picked up on recycling day or trash day. See the attached flyer.

Dog Ordinance Reminder - Overbrook does have an ordinance (ordinance 408) regarding pets on a leash and picking up your pet's feces. Police Department - From March 24th through April 4th, 2025, the Overbrook Police Department will participate in the Seatbelts Are For Everyone campaign sponsored by Drive Safe Kansas. Officers will conduct patrols to enforce seatbelts, distracted driving, speeding and other traffic laws especially around schools.

Town Hall Meeting - The Overbrook Police Department and Overbrook Public Safety Committee will host a town hall meeting on Monday, April 7th at 6:00 PM at City Hall to discuss requests from the public for an ordinance governing registration of ATVs in operation within city limits. The proposed ordinance is similar to those already in place in Carbondale and Osage City. Citizens are invited to attend to express ideas and concerns.

City Wide Clean Up - April 19th from 8am to Noon. Dumpsters will be placed in the parking lot west of the baseball fields and near The Bible Church for residents to drop off unwanted items, debris and more. Paint, oil, gasoline, tires, antifreeze/coolant, and other hazardous materials are <u>prohibited</u>. Overbrook Pride will provide shredding services in City Hall. Overbrook Rotary will pick up branches that are placed at the curb, cut into manageable sizes. The branches are the only thing that will be picked up. Everything else needs to be taken to the dumpsters. Once items are put into dumpsters, they cannot be rummaged through.

Overbrook Rotary – will pick up branches on City Wide clean up day April 19th. Branches and Limbs must be placed at the curb. The branches must be cut into manageable size pieces, limbs must have their branches removed and cut into 4 foot lengths. We would love to have any and all volunteers.
