Curbside pickup will be "every other" MONDAY at 6am

-All materials must be <u>inside the BLUB 65-gallon wheeled tote</u> which will be supplied to each residence. Any items outside the tote will not be picked up. Residents may rent an additional wheeled tote for \$4 per month. A wheeled recycling tote is available at each residence, so don't take it with you if you move. If non-recyclable materials are found in the tote, the entire tote will be rejected and left at the curb. The totes are **NOT** to be used for regular trash pickup on Fridays. A \$5.00 monthly service fee will be included in each residential Utility Bill.
