Watch out for buses loading and unloading students. Passing a school bus with its red lights flashing and stop sign swung out is illegal and dangerous. Before and after school, there is a crossing guard on US 56, just to the West of Oak. Not stopping for her or going around her is a violation. And of course, please be aware of the School Zone on US 56. Fines are doubled when lights are flashing. Also, many times in the morning, before the sun rises, it's difficult to see students walking to school. The gates to the tree dump are on the left. Only limbs and leaves may be dumped. No plastic bags, furniture, logs bigger than 18 inches in diameter, or construction material!
